Our parish will take up the Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS), next weekend, a collection approved by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to be taken every three years. The AMS provides pastoral care to Catholic men and women serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, enrolled at a U.S. Military Academy, being treated as a patient at any of the 153 U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers, or who work for the federal government beyond U.S. borders—including those from our own parish and diocese. The AMS does not receive any funding from the government or military, and has no parishes from which to receive a weekly assessment. The AMS is the ONLY U.S. Diocese that serves active-duty and Veterans, and their families. Approximately 1.8 million served from all U.S. dioceses. It is the ONLY U.S. Diocese to provide priests for the Church and the U.S. Military Chaplaincy.

The U.S. Military is the LARGEST source of priestly vocations in the USA.

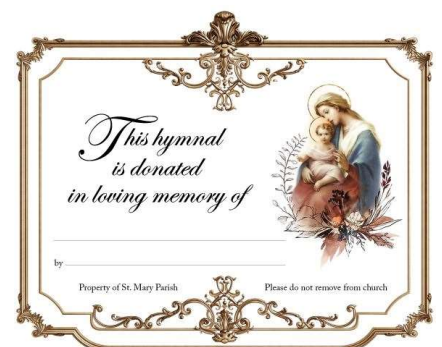
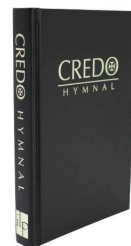
## **NOW AVAILABLE IN ST. MARY CHURCH:**

At the beginning of the new liturgical year, which begins with the First Sunday of Advent, we will be officially switching to a new hardcover book to be used at Mass. It is the CREDO Hymnal with Lectionary and contains readings for all 3 years in the liturgical cycle as well as over 650 hymns and songs. The CREDO Hymnal is the most complete traditional hymnal in the Church today. To help in covering the cost of the new hymnals, parishioners are offered the opportunity to have one or more hymnals dedicated in memory of a loved one by making a donation of \$25.00 per hymnal. A special label has been created to be placed on the inside of the front cover with its dedication and by whom.

The hymnals are parish property and are to remain in the pews.

The current Pew Missals will be valid until the new liturgical year.

To have a hymnal donated, please send a note to the parish office indicating to whom the donation is made and by whom, along with your \$25.00 per hymnal. You are welcome to mail it, drop it off at the office, or simply drop it in the weekend collection with CREDO written on the envelope.

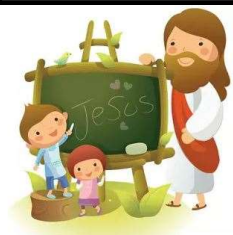

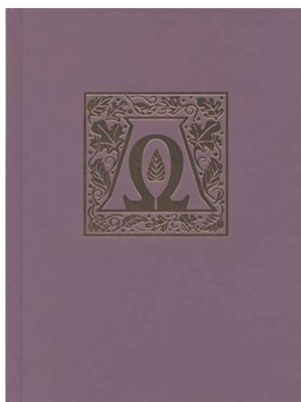

This year St. Mary Parish will begin this tradition and have available in the church a new *Book of the Names of the Dead* for you to write down the names of loved ones.

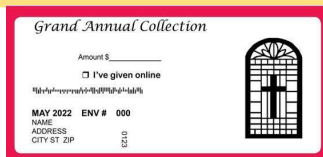
