Safe Parishioners - Secure Churches

Following the widespread emotional reactions to the Supreme Court leak and decision overturning Roe-v-Wade, and calls on social media for possible demonstrations and disruptions at Catholic churches, the Diocese of Manchester hired Blue-U.com, a security firm specializing in secure premises and training, to provide risk evaluations and basic security protocols for every Catholic church in New Hampshire, and all at Diocese expense.

While we have not experienced any such incidents at our churches here in Claremont, it was thought prudent to avail the free Diocesan security resources to conduct "walk-through" evaluations of our churches, provide some practical security tips and some basic training of Ushers/Greeters - - to keep our parishioners and visitors safe at Mass and preclude any untoward occurrences in church or on church property. Hence, all but main church doors will be locked at start of Mass to eliminate any troublesome entry, but yet enable exit at any time.

Being aware of our surroundings and acknowledging the possibility of problems arising from social activism or unrest, even as slight as they might be, is a good first step in personal as well as group safety and security.



Road Trip Pilgrimage

Take a "road trip pilgrimage" with Fr. Josh to explore the hidden Catholic gems across New Hampshire. Eucharistic Miracles

Auxiliary Bishop Andrew Conzens, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Evangelization and Catechesis detailed an initiative to launch a nationwide three year Eucharistic revival program beginning in 2022. He stated, "the initiative aims to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the holy Eucharist." Initial discussions of this was prompted by a 2019 Pew research showing that 69% of professed Catholics do not believe in transubstantiation, but rather believe the bread and wine used in Communion are merely symbols of the Body and Blood of Christ. Only 31% believed that the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Bishop Conzens went on to say, "right now, the Church in the United States needs the healing and unity that can flow from rekindling our love for the Eucharist."


