Next weekend, August 7th and 8th, as part of the Mission Cooperative Appeal in our diocese, we will welcome Brother Robert Hazard, FSC, from the Brothers of the Christian Schools to our parish.

The Brothers, commonly known as the De La Salle Christian Brothers, are an international community of men religious founded by St. John Baptist de La Salle in France in 1691.

St. John Baptist de La Salle renounced his family's abundant wealth and dedicated himself to working for the good of the economically poor, especially in the area of education. The Brothers' community has kept alive this dedication. While its Motherhouse is in Rome, the community has spread throughout the world, doing exactly as its founder prescribed.

In addition to their work here in the United States, where they run many schools, including La Salle University in Philadelphia, and Manhattan College in New York, the Brothers do extensive missionary work in foreign countries. Among these places are Ethiopia, Kenya, Nigeria, Nairobi, the Philippines, Vietnam, Haiti, and the West Indies. There they run schools, dedicated to educating under-privileged children. The Brothers also founded and run *Christ the Teacher Institute* in Nairobi where young adults are taught to become educators themselves so that they, in turn, can work with their own people.

The families pay very little for the education they receive in any of these schools. Consequently, the Brothers work with extremely limited sources. They, themselves, often live very poorly and simply, willing and happy to endure whatever they must to spread God's message of love, hope, and trust to those most in need as well as to give their students the intellectual tools necessary to better their futures and the futures of their people.

The Brothers look now to us for our prayers and our generosity to assist them with their very important work. Thank you in advance for whatever spiritual and financial support you may extend to the Brothers. They have assured us that every penny collected, resulting from their visit with us, will go directly to the missions in which they are engaged.
